MINUTES OF MEETING
CHEVY CHASE ESTATES ASSOCIATION

The first public meeting of the Chevy Chase Estates Association was held at the East Glen Oaks Recreation Hall, in the City of Glendale, at 8:00 p.m. June 9, 1937.

At the request of President Minckler, Mr. W. J. Barr opened the meeting, explaining its purpose, the completion of organization of members, and problems at hand.

President Minckler presented in brief form the Constitution and By Laws as adopted by the Directors at their meeting on June 7, 1937.

Time was given the Secretary for the acceptance of new members - 15 regular and one associate member being added to the roll.

Director Barr then presented the matter of the subdivision of the Chevy Chase Golf Course. Each member was urged to be present at the meeting Monday evening, June 14, 1937, of the City Planning Commission as a protest against the approval by that Commission of the subdivision of said Golf Course, on the grounds that the subdivision as proposed is not in keeping with the surrounding class of property, and that the proper drainage and sewage disposal has not been substantially provided.



Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Constitution and By Laws were unanimously approved by the new membership. Total attendance 41.
