

Barnett Re-elected Chevy Chase Chief

Dr. Kelso Grant Barnett, president of the Glendale Planning Commission, has been re-elected president of the Chevy Chase Estates Association, it was announced today.

Clare L. Randolph was elected vice president and Waler Stolrow was named to the board of directors. Two directors, George A. Green and Leo Z. Jelin, were re-elected.
